Qualifications

The successful candidate will hold a Ph.D. in finance. The candidate will preferably be interested or have experience in teaching investment management, investment banking, corporate finance, and contributing to the student managed portfolio trust. Teaching interests in the other relevant areas such as risk and insurance and financial institutions will also be considered.

The candidate is also expected to teach graduate courses and supervise research oriented graduate students (M.Sc.-Finance & Ph.D.-Financial Economics). The ideal candidate will be willing to work in a collaborative, collegial environment where teaching expertise and the ability to publish research in top Finance journals is highly valued. A professional finance designation (e.g. CFA) is a plus.

Consistent with its goal of achieving and sustaining business school accreditation (AACSB), Edwards School of Business will recruit those individuals whose academic training and/or professional activities clearly align with our recruitment standards. Candidates will require a doctoral degree in an academic area clearly linked to the field in which they are expected to teach.
