The Edwards School of Business has a dedicated space for Aboriginal students located in Room 91 of the Edwards building. The Centre is fully equipped with computers, a printer, course resource material, a telephone, a fridge, lounge area, and a new student board room to be utilized for group projects and brainstorming. The Centre is open to all students for Bannock Chat, held bi-weekly during the regular academic year. Other resources available to students include tutoring services, scholarships, emergency financial aid, and much more!

The Aboriginal Students' Centre (ASC), located in Marquis Hall, is available to all students on campus, and is an inclusive gathering space for students to come before and after classes to study, use a computer, connect with other students or access services. The ASC promotes the spiritual, physical, emotional and mental well-being of Aboriginal students on campus.

With over 2,000 self-identified Aboriginal students on the U of S campus and a location that puts you on the banks of the South Saskatchewan River, Saskatoon is the province's largest and most vibrant city with a growing Aboriginal population. Saskatoon is home to Aboriginal government offices, an urban reserve, Aboriginal economic development and a lively Aboriginal arts community.
