**Indigenous Business Students' Society (IBSS)** Join the IBSS to connect with a supportive community, celebrate Indigenous culture, and gain opportunities for personal, academic, and professional growth in business.

**Edwards Indigenous Student Residence Support** covers on-campus housing costs, providing a stable and supportive living environment to help ensure your academic success.

**Edwards Application Fee Waiver** covers the cost of your application to any Edwards program (B.Comm, CBUS, CENT, IBAC).

**Indigenous Learning Communities** empower first-year Indigenous business students to build connections, gain mentorship, and navigate university life with a sense of belonging and purpose.

**Rawlinson Centre for Indigenous Business Students** is one of the only dedicated spaces for Indigenous business students in the country. You can find a place to study, attend cultural events and access Rawlinson Centre Student Supports:

- **Emergency Assistance Fund** for students who are experiencing extenuating circumstances and financial crises. The Rawlinson emergency funding is a one-time emergency bursary of up to \$1,000.
- **Tutoring and Personalized Academic Support** includes funding for individual tutors in specific subjects and access to a weekly math tutor.
- **Rawlinson Professional Development Fund** to subsidize costs related to activities that support academic success and the development of a professional network (attending conferences, speaker nights, luncheons, and other engagements such as becoming a student member of a professional organization and/or board, etc.)
- **Grocery and Travel Gift Cards** to support students experiencing food insecurity and to provide means for students to travel home in case of ceremony or extenuating circumstances.
- **Bannock Chat** Bi-weekly on Thursday, the Rawlinson Centre hosts soup and bannock.

**Dedicated Indigenous Achievement Advisor** is available to answer your questions and support you during your time at Edwards.

**Co-op Program** offers 8-month paid work placements during your third year of the B.Comm program, providing valuable hands-on experience with top employers like SIGA, First Nations Bank, and Kitsaki Management Limited Partnership.
